




LUNCHTIME ASSISTANT VACANCY

Notification of Appointments

You may be aware that the Office have implemented many changes in the way information is received.

One of these changes is "Notification of Appointments".

If you have booked your child an appointment which is in school time or requires them to leave school early, it is imperative that you notify us via our googleform. This form must be completed at least TWO days prior to the appointment in order to allow the admin team to input the details onto your child's school record, ensure your child has a school lunch (if applicable) and advise the class teacher in good time.

Notifications received within 24 hours of an appointment may not be actioned in time for the appointment so your child will be delayed in coming to the office.

We are, of course, aware that there are times when this is unavoidable due to emergency appointments.

If you do not complete the online form and the office are not aware that your child requires a school dinner you will need to provide them with a home packed lunch.

Please can we also remind parents that when making any appointments for your child, you try to arrange non-urgent or non-specialist appointments (e.g. opticians, dentist and GP) for times that are outside of the school day or during the school holidays.

If your child needs to leave during the lunch break please can we ask that you arrange to collect them 10 minutes prior to the start of the lunchtime session. Although the school office is manned throughout the school day we cannot guarantee that we will be able to find your child once they are out on the playground as easily, which will delay your departure.












EYFS Summer

This half term Year R have been busy with their Spring and Growth topic. The children have enjoyed planting a seed and watching it grow. The children learnt all about the things that plants need to grow and have been busy helping in the school polytunnel. The children in EYFS have labelled parts of a plant.





The children were very excited to come into their classes one Monday morning to find that a giant beanstalk had grown over the weekend. They then received a nice letter from the giant telling them that he is a nice giant and he would love to find out more about them. The children then wrote letters back to the giant to telling them all about themselves and the things they like.







In our Maths learning we have been busy learning our numbers to 10 and thinking about what numbers go together to make 10. The children have been learning to 'subitise' where they can see a number representation (such as dots on a dice) and know what that number is without the need to count it.



The children have been developing all their writing skills and have been writing their own books, captions and labels.


Welcome to our Year 2 Newsletter

Year Three



In Maths, we have been building our knowledge on multiplication and division facts and spotting patterns. We have been building our confidence with mental methods in addition and subtraction. We have also developed our time telling skills to convert time to the 24-hour clock.

We have really enjoyed developing our cricket skills in our P.E. sessions and with Coach Jake. We are practising over arm bowling, catching and batting. The children have loved practising and are very competitive.

Music has continued this half term with the children starting to play the ukulele. We can't wait for our next concert at the end of term!

We thoroughly enjoyed our trip the Sea City museum.

We were able to have a go at steering the ship, and shovelling the coal into the boilers. In our workshop we discussed who should have been on the lifeboats.
Apparently if you are over forty you have lived long enough! We did experiments to show why the Titanic sunk as she did and what could have been done to prolong the sinking of the ship. We looked at historical objects that would have been on the Titanic and even got to smell what certain areas of the ship would have smelt

This half term we have been learning all about the Titanic. The children have enjoyed building their local historical knowledge about the events leading up to the fateful morning when she hit the iceberg. We have used drama to immerse ourselves in the experience of lst, 2nd and 3rd class passengers. In English, we have been looking at various texts to learn more about the experience on the Titanic. We have written diary entries and persuasive adverts combining and mastering our writing skills and learning new techniques and skills.





Sea City Museum



On Monday the 9th of May, Year 3 went on a trip to the Sea City Museum in Southampton. We are learning all about The Titanic this half term and were very excited to see what the museum had to offer.

On arriving, we split into our class groups for our first activities. Wren class started with a guided tour of the museum, learning all about the passengers on the Titanic, what they might have worn, what their jobs were and about some of the activities and duties completed on the Titanic. Jackdaw class started with a workshop of activities. They enjoyed discussing which passengers should have been chosen to go on to the lifeboats, discovering and naming artefacts from the boat and dressing up as passengers and crew members.

Each class then had some self-guided time exploring the museum. We especially loved coal shovelling — it was very hard, sweaty work! We will need some practise as most of us aren't yet quick enough! Finally, we heard some eyewitness reports from survivors and learnt about the investigation of the disaster on a large, cinema like screen. It was a lovely day and we are all now full of interesting facts we can't wait to share with you all!








The children wrote instructions on this should you wish to replicate at home








Year 4

And the first summer term is over! Our Year 5's have had a busy yet interesting term learning all about WW2 and the Spitfire. A shorter half term means there is a lot less time to learn about so much but the children have been amazing — they have worked so hard. We started our term with a successful evacuation day where the children understood what life would have been like to be evacuated during WW2. In English, the children wrote some informative diaries and letters about the evaucation process and have thoroughly enjoyed reading our book, Letters from the lighthouse. The children recreated some amazing silhouettes of the famous image of St Pauls Cathedral.



In DT, the children have studied, designed and made their Anderson Shelters, thinking carefully about its design and types of materials that would be best suited to withstand an "attack". The children also learnt about how a circuit is created to power a buzzer, which acted as an air raid siren. They have really enjoyed researching and learning how Eastleigh and surrounding areas have such an important role in creating the Spitfires that helped win the war. In Science, we recapped on some important lessons about plants to secure missed knowledge.


We are so proud of the achievements of all of the children in Year 6 and have been blown away by their tremendous efforts and excellent attitudes.





The Nightingale Minis also participated in the event and walked away with the 'Most Magical' certificate, trophy and medals.


