Dear Parents,

I think you'll all join me in welcoming the summer break and all the excitement that it brings, as well as appreciating the important opportunity for everyone to switch off for some time from the pressures of the busy term.

What a delight it was to accompany our Year 4s on their residentials to the beautiful Minstead Study Centre. They represented our school so well with their positive mindset and 'Can do' attitude to the challenges they faced whilst away from the comforts of their own homes. We saw boosts in confidence, improved communication skills as they encouraged their peers and navigated their way through challenges, independence, empathy and of course team work. It has left us all very excited about the forthcoming trip in September for our current Year 3s and of course the heights of the Brecon Beacons (now officially known as Bannau Brycheiniog) for our current Year 5s.



At the beginning of July, Mrs Saunders and I were asked to speak by Inspectors at the County Inclusion Conference. We were honoured, but nervous of course, to present to colleagues from across the county on how the expertise among the teaching and support team has supported our children in becoming increasingly independent. We talked of the precise design of learning, the great pedagogical skills of our teachers and the climate for learning that has been created at Nightingale. We are now receiving requests for visits and we look forward to sharing our great

practice and adaptive teaching approaches with other schools.

I am pleased to share the outcome of our recent Parent Survey with you. Thank you to those of you who took the time to add additional comments; we were touched by so many of them. It certainly does give us the motivation to continue to raise standards in every area, helping our children to achieve their full potential. Like you, we want the very best for our children and the school.

Here is a summary of the results:

89% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child feels safe at NPS with 6% knowing who to go to if they feel unsafe.

86% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that the school promotes good behaviour and challenges poor behavioural choices. Maintaining high expectations of behaviour in our diverse community can be challenging at times and we thank you all for your support in this. In the autumn term, we will be running specialist training for parents to support them in creating the skills empathy, positive parenting approaches and appropriate expectations. More details to follow in the new term!

54% said that their child had not been bullied and 25% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that the school had dealt with bullying quickly and effectively. A further 8% said they did not know (87% in total). We did however, have 13% of parents who disagreed with this. We always appreciate the feedback and will endeavour to reflect and evaluate our systems so that everyone feels supported through what is a very serious and sensitive matter that can have long term affects on children. We do not tolerate any form of bullying in our school.

91% (increase from last year) said that our school values of Respect, Courage, Compassion and Friendship encourage their child to make positive choices. A further 4% were unsure. We immerse our children in these values so it brings us great joy to hear how they take them beyond the school gates and talk of them at home.

93% (increase from last year) said that the school makes them aware of what their child will be learning. We are very pleased that the vast majority of our parents feel well informed.

60% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that NPS responds well to any concerns raised (22% said they have not raised any concerns). Concerns are subjective so it is always a challenge to get this right for every parent especially if they have not had the outcome they would like. However, we hope that parents who have not had the outcome they had liked, understand the reasons behind this and understand our children are always at the heart of our professional decision making.

The survey had a great response from families who have children on our SEND register - 32% of respondents! The vast majority of these felt that their child was supported well.

86% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that NPS has high expectations of their child. 7% didn't know. We do have high expectations of all our pupils, both in their conduct and academically. We expect all our pupils to *Inspire to Aspire!*

85% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that we let parents know how their children are doing. We would like to see this at a higher rate next year. On top of our two reports we send home annually, our three parents' evenings and additional parents evening for pupils who have SEND and teacher's informal updates, we will look at other means to do this.

90% (increase from last year) of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child does well at NPS.

91% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that NPS offers a good range of subjects.

78% said that the skills their child learns in PE encourages them to be more active with 9% unsure.

82% of parents said that their child can take part in clubs and activities. This is slightly down on last year and lower than we would like do we will look to address this.

76% of parents said that the school supports their child's wider personal development with 14% unsure. Again, we would like to see improvements in this area with teachers and leaders already looking at making enhancements within our curriculum to enable this.

This feedback helps with our evaluation cycle so thank you again for your input in this. Our priority is always to take the school forward recognising the <u>current</u> strengths as well as addressing areas where the school needs to improve. It is clear that our thoughts around improvement align with some of yours.

We value the partnership we have with our parents and know that a strong partnership leads to great outcomes for children, so if for any reason you have disagreed to any of the statements I would welcome a meeting with you.

Wishing you all a fabulous summer break and looking forward to seeing the children return to their new year groups refreshed and ready for the learning opportunities that await them.

beautiful butterflies. The children were excited to release the butterflies and wave goodbye to them as they flew away.







Year | Summer Can you believe we're at the end of Year !! It's been another busy half term with lots of poetry writing, sewing & clay work.

Maths: In Maths we have been exploring capacity using rice and water to fill & compare different containers. We have been identifying containers that are full, empty and half full. We also enjoyed working out how many cups of water we needed to fill different containers.










History: Our focus this half term has been Florence Nightingale & Mary Seacole & learning about why they are considered to be significant historical figures.










Monday 12th June was the start of our annual Maths Week. The children all took part in a Children versus Teachers TTRS battle. We also had lots of fun activities
