In <u>English</u>, your child will:

In Maths, your child will:

Count in 2's and 10's Find doubles to ten. Find ten more and less Use number lines to add and subtract. Recognise coins and notes, ordering amounts comparing coins Reason and problem solve using known facts Use number bonds to solve problems.

In Science, your child will know that

Animals are grouped into five different animal groups and that they have common features.

Compare animals of the same and different groups.

Animals have different diets and will be using the technical vocabulary of Herbivore, omnivore and carnivore.

Animals live in different habitats and are dependent upon this habitat for survival.

Animals are in a food chain where different animals are need to eat other animals or plants to survive..

In <u>Arl</u>, your child will:

Eric Carle is an artist and illustrator of children's books.

Using techniques that Eric Carle uses using paint and printing techniques.

Relief printing using string (Callograph) and using foam tiles indented.

The children will plan how they will make an animal picture.

Make an animal picture using the techniques that the children have learnt based on Eric Carle.

Evaluate their picture and make changes.

In <u>History</u>, your child will know that:

There are three important queens in British History -

Queen Elizabeth I, Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth II.

We will be looking at their reign, important events that happened and how long ago it was. We will be using the timeline to help us.

In **Geography**, your child will know that:

There are 4 countries in the United Kingdom.
