In English, your child will write:

A biography of Nelson Mandela using: relative clauses and cohesive devices, expanded noun phrases, formal language and commas for clarity.

We will be using the text driver, 'A Long Walk to Freedom' to stimulate and generate ideas for our writing.

In Maths, your child will:

Recognise and use equivalent fractions, up to 1000ths.

Know and use decimal, fractional and % equivalents
Estimate, compare, recognise and find acute, obtuse, and reflex angles.

identify angles at a point and one whole turn (360°), at a straight line/half a turn (180°)

Mentally add and subtract with increasingly large numbers.

Add and subtract numbers with more than 4 digits

Solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems

Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator beyond 1.

Solve problems using up three decimals places.

Solve problems involving measure.

Living things can be divided into groups based upon their characteristics

Classification keys help group, identify and name living things

Lifecycles vary in time depending on the species of animal

All animal life cycles begin with growth and development followed by reproduction

Some animals undergo a complete metamorphosis as they grow.
